 - o Report cards will be home every nine weeks.
 - o Classroom assessments will be sent home for parental review.
 - o Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held in the fall and in the Spring by teacher or parent request.
- Provide opportunities for Title I parents to volunteer, participate, and observe in their children's classrooms. Sec. 1116 (d) (2) (C)
 - o Provide opportunities for participation in Parent Involvement Team Meetings or Chaperones for field trips.
 - Allow for observations in classrooms and lunchroom (Approval through the office must be given.)
