### **Brown City Elementary Parent and Family Engagement Policy**

#### **MISSION STATEMENT:**

The mission of the Brown City Elementary School is to provide a place where each student will receive individual attention to their intellectual, social, emotional, and physical needs. Parental support includes, but is not limited to, monitoring attendance, homework completion, television watching, use of extra-curricular time, and actively participating in a child's education.

# Part I: Policy Involvement

Brown City Elementary School Staff believes that parents play a key role in a child's education, and students are more successful when parents are actively involved and engaged throughout the school year. This policy was created as a collaborative effort between parents and staff. - Provide parents of Title I students the opportunity to interact with teachers regarding the education of their children. Parents mayl be included in the decision making process, and parent suggestions will be utilized to improve our program. Revise Schoolwide plan to meet the needs of parents and students.   - Conduct Parent Surveys periodically throughout the school year, both on paper and electronically.
  - o Hold Title I meetings at flexible times throughout the school year.
  - o Parent/Teacher Conferences (Fall), additional conferences per parent or teacher request when possible.
  - o Communicate through telephone calls, emails, and progress reports.
  - Ensure that if the schoolwide program plan is not satisfactory to parents of participating students, submit any parent comments on the plan when the school makes the plan available to the LEA.
  - o Parents may give dissenting opinions on Individualized Reading Improvement Plan when conferencing with teachers.

    - Parents will be contacted when there is a drastic change in grades.
  - o Report cards sent home every nine weeks.
  - Classroom assessments will be sent home for parent review.
  - o Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held in the fall.
  - Parent access to "Skyward"-Online grading system K-12.
- Provide opportunities for parents to volunteer, participate, and observe in their children's classrooms. Sec. 1116 (d) (2) (C)
  - o Provide opportunities for participation in Parent Involvement Team, being Room Parents and/or Chaperones for field trips.
  - o Provide "Take Home Book Programs" that engage parents with students learning.
